COMPANY OVERVIEW

The Company owns interests in seven four-season mountain resorts with more than 11,000 skiable acres and more than 1,150 acres of land available for real estate development. Intrawest's mountain resorts are geographically diversified across North America's major ski regions, including the Eastern United States, the Rocky Mountains, the Pacific Southwest and Canada. The Company also operates an adventure travel business, the cornerstone of which is Canadian Mountain Holidays, the leading heli-skiing adventure company in North America. RESORT OVERVIEW AND CULTURE

Stratton was established in 1961, and expanded rapidly into one of Vermont's largest ski areas. Stratton sits at 3,875 feet and offers a beautiful view of the Green Mountains. Its ski area covers 670 acres and includes 97 ski trails for the enjoyment of skiers and snowboarders of all levels. One of the most powerful snowmaking systems in Southern Vermont, Stratton has snow guns on 93% of the mountain allowing us to offer impeccable snow conditions. Stratton has an average annual snowfall of 180 inches (460 cm). Stratton also ranks in the top 10 (SKI Magazine) for snow, grooming, lifts, terrain parks, service, lodging, dining, on-mountain food, après and nightlife.

POSITION SUMMARY To perform a variety of specialized tasks and technical functions essential to the operation and maintenance of the water production and sewer treatment and disposal systems to ensure the health and safety of all customers internal and external. Through the daily monitoring and maintenance of these systems we are able to provide uninterrupted, quality service.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES

- Monitor water production systems, storage systems and **distribution systems**
- Monitor sewer **collection system** and spray disposal systems
- Analyze and calculate results from water and wastewater samples for process control
- Input data generated during daily monitoring into spreadsheets for reporting to the State of Vermont
- Maintain grounds of facility and all outbuildings including mowing, snow removal, landscaping, cleaning and painting
- Inspect and perform routine maintenance on a wide range of operational equipment including pumps, motors, valves, gauges and meters
- Inspect and perform routine maintenance on all equipment such as mowers, snow blowers, snowmobiles, 4-wheelers, and trimmers
- Assist with construction and permitting projects
- Respond to emergencies
- Respond to customer complaints
- Utility locating

PHYSICAL DEMANDS AND WORKING CONDITIONS

This position will require work on weekends, holidays and some evenings.

Office Environment:

- Able to lift, carry, or otherwise move and position a minimum of 50 pounds on an occasional basis.
- Manual dexterity to operate a computer and other common office equipment on a daily basis.
- Ability to work for extended periods of time standing, walking, kneeling, pushing and pulling on an occasional basis.

Mountain Environment:

- The primary physical environment in which this position works is out of doors with a high exposure level to cold, snow, wind, rain, bugs, sun, high altitude, extreme heights, lightning, etc...
- The degree of strenuous activity within the job is considered to be high. Often lifting a weight of 50 pounds throughout the day is common.
- Additional strenuous physical activity may include walking or hiking upon uneven, challenging terrain with heavy tools or equipment.
- Exposure to: Chemicals required for cleaning, de-greasing, disinfecting and painting. Ultra Violet radiation from the sun enhanced through lack of atmospheric filtration at work altitude. Fumes produced in activities ranging from cleaning to painting to fabrication of metal products. Noise generated by snowmobiles, 4 wheeler, motors, blowers and tools may require hearing protection to be worn.
- Talking and hearing occur continuously in the process of communicating with guests, supervisors and other employees.
- Vision occurs continuously with the most common visual functions being those of near vision and depth perception.
- Able to wear personal protective equipment including but not limited to non-slip shoes, protective eye wear, and protective gloves.

To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential duty satisfactorily- reasonable accommodations may be made to enable qualified individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.
