

A living wage is the amount of money an individual must earn to meet their basic needs for quality of life, such as **food**, **housing**, **transportation**, **health care**, and **child care**. The living wage differs from the minimum wage in that the minimum wage is set by law and can fail to meet the requirements to have a basic quality of life and leaves individuals and families to rely on government programs for support.


